Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Mark

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus the king addresses those who gathered around him desirous of becoming part of his new kingdom, the Church. Our Lord sat down and opened his mouth to give his blessings and his encouragement to those of us who are poor in spirit, meek, persecuted and hungry for righteousness. Despite our lowliness in this world, we have the consolation of knowing that we provide light for the world and that we will be great in the kingdom of heaven. After imparting his kingdom blessings and encouragement, he then gave us his new kingdom law. Six times he referred to laws given by God to Moses on Mount Sinai. Then, since he himself is God, he audaciously proposes some improvements and refinements of the old law. Six times he uses the words: "You have heard it said... but

I say to you..."

In today's Gospel, we have five of these six "antitheses." In each case, Jesus quotes from the laws of the Old Testament and then proposes a new law for the children of the Kingdom of Heaven. In the Old Testament, there was a king who ruled over twelve tribes of Israel. Jesus came to establish a "New Israel," the Church, which would be guided by twelve apostles who would go out to all of the corners of the world.

Jesus expressed the requirements for those who wish to be members of this new family of God: "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect," and "Unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of God." At the time of Jesus, it was known that the scribes and Pharisees were content with

observing the bare minimum and the externals of the law. There were limits to their love. They made exceptions and allowed a man to hate his enemy, to exact revenge and to divorce his wife. Jesus offered his followers both the invitation and the spiritual graces to live in a new way. It would be a difficult way that would involve carrying one's cross and turning the other cheek and going the extra mile. But the rewards would be out of this world!

Saint of the Week

The Feast of the Chair of St. Peter

Feast Day: February 22

On February 22nd each year, the Church celebrates the feast of the Chair of St. Peter. This might seem odd, as the church doesn't venerate furniture. There's no feast of the end-tables of St. Cyprian, or feast of the Sofa of St. Andrew. So, what's with the chair? In pre-Christian Rome, the feast of Parentalia (celebrated in the third week of February) commemorated deceased relatives and friends, and it was traditional to leave an empty chair at the table in their honor. This empty chair has parallels in many other faiths, including Judaism. Christianity, in its early centuries, often established feasts and holiday that coincided with, and generally supplanted, the celebrations of the larger

culture. As early as the 4th Century, there is evidence of a Christian feast celebrating the Chair of Peter. The significance isn't the chair itself, but rather the authority it represents. The Latin word for chair, cathedra, is where we get the word cathedral. And when a pope speaks a pronouncement with his full authority as head of the Church, he is said to speak "ex cathedra" or, "from the chair." So, when we observe the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter, we're celebrating the office of the pope as the authoritative head of the Church.

As for St. Peter's original chair, it is represented in St. Peter's basilica in Rome by an elaborate sculpture by Bernini. The relics of the chair itself are in the Vatican treasury, and not on public display. Those relics were given to the Vatican in the year 875 by King Charles II of France. -Fr. Larry Rice

Our next BINGO will be on Thursday, March 12! Doors open at 5:30pm and games begin at 6:30pm. for the 2020-2021 school year!



FASTING & ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Abstinence laws consider that meat comes only from animals such as chickens, cows, sheep or pigs, all of which live on land. Birds are also considered meat. Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Fish are a different category of animal. Salt and freshwater species of fish and shellfish are permitted.



SEEKING PART-TIME OR FULL-TIME YOUTH MINISTER

This position implements the parish's commitment to total youth ministry in a comprehensive manner. Youth Ministry's overall goal is to evangelize high school youth in five ways: formation, fellowship, liturgy, service, and family life. Youth and their families must know, through the Church's ministry that they are personally loved by God and have a place in the community of the Church. Youth Ministry should help parents weather the storm of adolescence and help young people see themselves in relation to the family, be it their present family or their own family in the future.

Youth Ministry is above all relational but must also operate within an organized and consistent program. A high degree of interpersonal skills are necessary, including the ability to recruit and motivate new teen and young adult catechists. The Youth Minister both organizes the people and events that serve to evangelize our youth and their families, and he/she also engages in direct relational ministry to youth.
