Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

November 3, 2019

A Message from Fr. Mark

Our Sunday readings today speak of the mercy of God that has "come down upon the earth" and walks the streets of our cities. The first reading from the Book of Wisdom declares, "You have mercy on all... you overlook people's sins that they may repent. For you love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made... you rebuke offenders little by little, warn them and remind them of the sins they are committing, that they may abandon their wickedness and believe in you, O LORD!"

We believe that Jesus is the Divine Mercy itself who became a man and walked the earth. In the Gospel, it says that Jesus was walking through the streets of Jericho when he looked up and saw a sinner named Zacchaeus in a tree. Jesus felt compassion toward him and even went to his home, which caused Zacchaeus to completely change his sinful life. (Luke 19:1-10)

This is a beautiful description of what also happens when priests and religious men and women walk through our community and help inspire sinners to trust in God's mercy. This week is National Vocation Awareness Week (November 3-9, 2019) which has been established by the United States Bishops as a time to promote to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life. Priests and deacons and religious sisters are those people who continue to walk the streets of our land so that people can still experience the joy and hope that comes from God's mercy. During this week our priests and deacons and religious sisters will be giving homilies and talks at Masses and in our religious education classes about the importance of promoting vocations. If we don't have vocations, who will walk the streets of Stockton to give people hope and salvation? As Jesus says: "I will make you fishers of

men" (Mark 1:17) and "The harvest is rich, and laborers are few." (Matthew 39:7)

Abba, Father, you loved the world so much that you sent your Son, Jesus the Christ, to be our Savior. He established your kingdom of justice, love and peace.

Saint of the Week

Dedication of the Lateran Basilica Feast Day: November 9

On this feast day, the Church celebrates the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, also known as the Papal Archbasilica of Saint John, which is the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome. Rather than St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, the St. John Lateran Basilica is also the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father, the Bishop of Rome.

The site of the basilica dates back to Constantine, who received the land from the Lateran family. Over the years, several buildings were erected, though all succumbed to war and natural disasters. The current structure was commissioned in 1646 by Pope Innocent X. The importance of the

Lateran Basilica has spread far beyond Catholicism as it is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

We celebrate the dedication of the Basilica as a feast day for all parishioners worldwide. As the

Lateran Basilica is the Pope's cathedral, it represents the parish church for all Catholics. Even though it may not be the physical church of parishioners around the world, it is the spiritual home of those who are the Church.

Tips for Building a Domestic Church Begin praying as a family and reading from Scripture daily, certainly before meals, but also first thing in the morning or before bed. Find a time that works for your family. Use the liturgy of the Church as a model for prayer, and try to include heartfelt unstructured prayer as well.

- Have a crucifix in a prominent place in the home, and in every bedroom.
- Make the Sacraments a regular celebration – take the whole family to Confession and Mass!
- Begin family traditions based on the seasons celebrated in the liturgical calendar.
- Make worshipping God a priority. Never miss Mass, even while traveling. Go to www.MassTimes.org to find a church near you!
- Teach stewardship and charity to your children, through word and example.
- Demonstrate love for your spouse, your children, your neighbors, and the world. Remind your children that they are loved by God and have been given gifts to serve others.
- Talk freely about the presence of God in the joys and sorrows of your life.
- Welcome into your home and support priests, brothers, sisters, deacons, and lay ministers in the Church.
- Participate in the lay ministries and activities of your parish community.

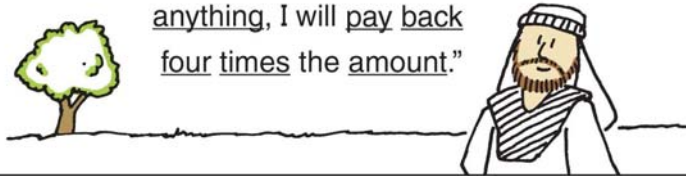
